

Sherbondy Hollow Road, Fayette County, PA.

Sherbondy Hollow Road is a name the locals use for a street with a different official name. The origins of the name are not documented. Here are some examples where it has been referenced and the official name:

A fire in Nov 2022 burned in the Grindstone area of Jefferson Township, PA. “Dozens of fire companies from six counties were called to the scene in a heavily wooded area of **Sherbondy Hollow Road**. There was no initial word on what sparked the fire.”

In April, 2022, the Grindstone Volunteer Fire Department searched for a man who was assaulted in the woods and found 100 people partying. “When they initially searched for the man near **Sherbondy Hollow**, the department said they stumbled upon 100 young people having a drinking party.”

In a time capsule from 1960, opened in 2005, it references a detour that used the road. “A crack has developed in the Coal Hill-Braznell Road, caused by mine subsidence in the area. The road surface started to crack last weekend, resulting in warning signs being posted. Subsequently the road was completely closed to traffic. Residents of the Braznell area are traveling by way of Grindstone and the Albany-**Sherbondy Hollow road**.”

In Oct 2024, another report on a fire in Fayette County clarified the existence somewhat, “Grindstone Fire Chief Rich Lenk said the call came in shortly before noon for the blaze at **Lynn Bottom Road**, better known as **Sherbondy Hollow**, in Jefferson Township.”
