About six years ago, while talking with Edna Sherbondy d/o David & Osha (Reynolds) Sherbondy. she Laid "The Sherbondy's came from either New Jersey or Maryland to Penna. about 1795 and were of French descent." However, in the Sherbondy History of Fayette Co., Pa., it is stated that they were of German descent. This we will accept as well as their migration to Penna. in 1795, unless we get definite further written proof. The first written proof we have is the following WILL of John Sherbondy written April 15, 1798, which has been copied in full by compiler.

Will John Sherbondy In the name of God Amen, The 15th Day of Deceased April A. D. 1798. I John Sherbondy of #208 South Huntington township Westmoreland county and State of Pennsylvania being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God Calling to mind and mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die Do make and ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say first and principally of all I give and Reccommend my soul into the hands of God who gave it, and my body Reccomend it to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like and Decent manner at the Directions of my Executor not doubting but that I shall Receive the same again by the mighty Power of God: and as Touching my worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life. I give devise and Dispose of the same in the Following Lanner and form, First I give and bequeath to my son Melukor Sherbondy Two hundred Pounds Lawful Money of Pennsylvania which he hath already Received and fifty four Pounds over and above his Child's part, Whom I Do make and ordain one of my Executors to this my last will and Testament. Likewise I give and bequeath unto my son George Sherbondy the sum of Two Hundred pounds out of which he hath already Received the sum of one hundred and twenty four pounds whome I likewise make and ordain my Executor to this my last will -- Likewise I give and Bequeath unto my son Philip Sherbondy the sum of Two hundred pounds Lawful money as aforesaid -- out of which he hath Received Eighty Two pounds. Likewise I give and bequeath unto my son John Sherbondy the sum of Two hundred pounds like money aforesaid. Like-I give and bequeath unto my son Jacob Sherbondy the sum of Two hundred pounds like money as aforesaid -- Likewise I give and toqueath unto my daughter Catherine Sherbondy the sum of Two hundred pounds lawful money as above Hentioned -- and whereas I Expect to remain with my son George Sherbondy, I give him over and above his Childs part as above Mentioned My Clock and twenty five pounds in money for which he shall mentain me During my Natural 11fe -- what there may yet Remain and whatsoever their shall Remain of my property in my possession over and above that what is heretofore Mentioned in this my will my Heirs as above Mentioned shall Distribute the same Equal among themselves, after my Discease And I do hereby utterly dialow Revoke Disannul all and very other former Testaments wills and Legacies bequests and Executors by me in anyways before this time named willed and Bequeathed Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be my last

will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written.
