Will

In the name of God Amen
I Jacob Carpenter being of
sound mind but from all human
appearance I expect my dissolution

I hereby to take place I make this my last will and testament
firstly I request my executor hereafter named to sell all my personal
estate at 12 months credit and pay all my just debts and
funeral expenses. and secondly I give land bequeath unto
my two daughters Margaret Shidmore and Hannah Wease
in the heirs of their Body forever my plantation that I
now live on to be equally divided between them with this
understanding that if my personal property does not pay
my funeral expenses and all my just debts they
must pay the residue of my just debts until my
land is clear of encumbrance I also give and bequeath
unto my several sons to wit Levi Carpenter, Comer
Carpenter, Jacob Carpenter Jr and the heirs of my
son Solomon Carpenter I desire and authorize my
executor hereafter named to pay each of them one
dollar each which is to be their share of my
real and personal estate and in the course of time
my two daughters should consider it to their advan-
tage to sell the land their are hereby authorized
at any time in their life time to sell the above mentioned
land and divide the proceeds of said land equally betw-
een them and lastly I appoint Samuel Elliott
my Executor of this my last will and testament.

In the name of God Amen
I James Heatherly, being sick
and weak in body, but of a
sound mind and disposing

memory, for which I thank God, and calling to mind
the uncertainty of human life, and being desirous to dispose of
all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with
I give and bequeath the same in manner following that is to say
1st After the payment of all my just debts and funeral expenses
I give to wife Nancy Heatherly all of my Estate, Both Real and
personal, for and during the term of her natural life, with
the exception of one Cow one Bed and Bedding and four head
of sheep which I give to my Daughter Lukinda, and after
the decease of my wife, I give to my son John Heatherly one
Dollar, also I give my son Benjamin Heatherly one Dollar
and the heirs of my son Adam Heatherly one Dollar and
Give to my daughter Nancy one dollar, and the heirs of my
Daughter Rachel, I give one dollar, all the Rest of my Estate
Real and personal of what nature or Kind soever it may be,
not herein before named which I give to my son Samuel
Heatherly which I give to them their heirs executors adminis-
trators forever, and lastly I do hereby constitute David Anglin
Executor of this my last will and Testament, Revoking all
former wills and Testaments. In testimony whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 27 day of
January 1851.
