

PIONEER RESIDENT.

Levi Sherbondy of Portage Tp.
Died Wednesday.

He Lived On Sherbondy Hill
83 Years.

Levi Sherbondy, one of Portage township's pioneer citizens, died Wednesday about 3:30 o'clock, of old age.

Mr. Sherbondy was 86 years of age and had lived in Portage township for 83 years. His death was rather sudden. He lived with his daughter, Mrs. F. A. Patton on Sherbondy hill, and Wednesday afternoon she was preparing him some food. He was helpless and when she returned to the room where she left him he was lying on the sofa dead.

Mr. Sherbondy was born in Westmoreland county, Pa., March 12, 1813. When he was 3 years of age his father, John Sherbondy, with his two brothers, Peter and George, came to Ohio and settled on the hill that bears their name, and Mr. Sherbondy had lived on it ever since. He was a retired farmer, and had massed a comfortable competence during his younger days. His wife, formerly Miss Elizabeth Smith, died in 1870 and since that time he resided with members of the family in the old homestead.

Mr. Sherbondy's family was composed of five sons and two daughters. The sons are, William, Charles, Homer, Joseph P. and Thomas, and the daughters, Mrs. F. A. Patton and Mrs. L. M. Biggs. Both daughters and three of the sons survive Mr. Sherbondy. The two dead are William and Homer. Charles lives in Oregon, and the remainder live in this city.

Funeral services will be held at the residence of F. A. Patton, Friday afternoon, at 3:30 o'clock. Interment at Glendale.
