This Indenture made the Twenty Third day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand  
 hundred and Ninety two Between Frederick Marshall of Salem in the County of Northampton in the  
 State of North Carolina Esquire by his Lawfull Attorneys John Ettrivin of Bethlehem in the County  
 of Northampton in the State of Pennsylvania Black Paul Minister of Bethlehem aforesaid Plaintiff and  
 Christian Schweiing of the same place Esquire specially constituted by the one part and  
 bantie commonly called John Sherbanie of Cherruthill Township in the County of Northampton aforesaid witness to  
 grant Whereas the said Frederick Marshall by his Power of Attorney or Letter of Procurator duly executed and delivered  
 the Twenty eighth day of May 1783 reciting as is therein recited did constitute and appoint the above named Sir  
 Paul Minister and Hans Christian Schweiing his true and lawfull Attorneys jointly and severally for him in his name  
 stead to make execute seal and deliver all such Deed or Deeds Conveyance or conveyances or short and long  
 necessary in the Law for the full and absolute upholding and conveying of such part or parcels of Land or Encumbrances or  
 enties to such person or persons his her or their Heirs and assigns for ever unto whom they the said Attorneys may judge  
 right and for his Interest to contract with for the sale off any of his lands in the State of Pennsylvania if the  
 Land to grant and convey for such price and considerations as the said Attorneys shall or convenientarty con  
 sider in the Land shall be reasonably advised and advised and such Deed or Deeds Conveyance or conveyances  
 nowledge in due form of Law by them and by the said in part recited Power of Attorney, duly proved and en  
 record in the Office for Recording of Deeds in and for the County of Northampton in Book D. vol. 1. Page 138,  
 being therunto had more fully and at large appears Now this Indenture Witnesseth that for and in Consideration  
 of the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Two Pounds lawful money of Pennsylvania unto them the said  
 Ettrivin Paul Minister and Hans Christian Schweiing in hand well and truly paid unto before the execu  
 tion delivery hereof for the use of the said Frederick Marshall by the said John Sherbanie Receipt there  
 ond Frederick Marshall by his said Attorneys doth hereby acknowledge and thereof doth acquit and forever  
 charge the said John Sherbanie his Heirs and assigns by these presents To the said Frederick Marshall  
 said Attorneys John Ettrivin Paul Minister and Hans Christian Schweiing hath granted Bargained and  
 sold and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell release and confirm unto the said  
 Sherbanie his Heirs and assigns All that Leasage tenement and tract or piece of Land situate lying  
 being in Cherruthill Township aforesaid bounded and described as followeth viz Beginning at a post or corner  
 now or late of William gerasme the land now or late was on East Ninety three perches to a post the same  
 by other lands of the said Frederick Marshall now in the tenure of Mannie Meyer and partly by lands  
 Richard Peters Esquire North fifteen degrees West Two Hundred and Ninety five perches to a stone  
 over of John Philip Shippis Land the same South Seventy five degrees West Two Hundred  
 Thirty six perches to a post a corner of land now or late of William gerasme the same the three  
 and distances following vizt South fifteen degrees East Two hundred and nine perches to a post North  
 two degrees East one hundred and fifty perches to a post and South fifteen degrees East forty four perches  
 place of Beginning containing three hundred and thirty six acres and one quarter of an acre of land or  
 less besides the customary allowance of six acres per cent for Roads &c &c being part of a tract of land  
 hundred and Ninety five acres which by a Proprietary Patent dated the first day of February in the year  
 on Record at Philadelphia in Patent Book A. vol. 16 Page 107 &c was granted unto Frederick Marshall  
 and which part by sundry divers conveyances became and is now vested in the said Frederick  
 Marshall and by the said Deeds and conveyances duly proved as well as by a Synopsis or title to the  
 herein annexed relation being therunto had more fully and at large appears together with all  
 singular the buildings out houses Richards Meadows gardens Ways Woods Waters Water courses Im  
 plements Rights Liberties Members and appurtenances whatsoever thereto belonging or in any man  
 ner taining and the Reversion and Reversions Remainder and Remainders Rents Issues and Profits the  
 So There and to hold the said above described Leasage tenement and tract of land hereby granted  
 mentioned to be granted with the improvements or Encumbrances and appurtenances unto the said Frederick  
 Marshall his Heirs and assigns to the only prospere and behoof of him the said John Sherbanie his Heirs  
 and assigns for ever And the said Frederick Marshall by his said Attorneys John Ettrivin Paul Minister and

the said Frederick Marshall and his Heirs the said Stephen Sonement Trusty & Land Grantments  
and Premises heretofore granted with the appurtenances unto the said John Sherbantie his Heirs and assigns  
against him the said Frederick Marshall and his Heirs and against all and every other person or persons  
whatsoever lawfully claiming or to claim by former or under ton them or any of them shall and will  
Warrant and for ever defend by these presents And from time to time and at all times hereafter upon the  
reasonable request and at the proper Cost and Charges in the Laws of the said John Sherbantie his Heirs or his  
agents make do deal and execute or procure to be made done sealed and executed all and every such further  
and other lawful and reasonable act and acts thing and things devise and devise in the said conveyance  
and conveyances aforesome and aforesame in the laws whatsoever for the further & the more perfect grant  
ing conveying releasing and confirming of all and singular the Premises aforesaid with the appurtenances and  
every part and parcel thereof unto the said John Sherbantie his Heirs and assigns as by the said John Sherbantie his  
Heirs or assigns or by his or their counsel learned in the Law shall be lawfully and reasonably advised desired and  
required in things whereof the said parties have Interchangeably set their hands and seals hereunto the said witness  
subscribing the name and sealing with the seal of their Constituent and their own names and seals on the day  
and year first above written - Frederick Marshall *(Signed)* John Ettrin *(Signed)* Paul Minister *(Signed)* Hans Christian Schweiing *(Signed)*  
Deed sealed and delivered by the above named John Ettrin, Paul Minister & Hans Christian Schweiing signing  
with the name and sealing with the seal of their constituent Fredk Marshall and with their own names and  
seals in the presence of John Shopp John Bonn Northampton County pa: on the 23<sup>d</sup> day of May  
1792 A.D Before me Jno: Storfield Justice of the peace in and for the County of Northampton  
came the above named John Ettrin Paul Minister and Hans Christian Schweiing and severally acknowledged  
the above written Indentures to bear well the act and deed of their abovenamed constituent Frederick Marshall  
as their own act and Deed and desired the same may be recorded as such according to Law witness my hand &  
Seal on the day & year aforesaid Jno: Storfield Received the day of the date of the written instrument in  
presence of the within named John Sherbantie the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Pounds lawful Money  
of Pennsylvania & being the consideration sum therein mentioned I say received him for the use of  
Frederick Marshall alias Schweiing witness present at signing John Schopp.

of Deeds in and for the County of Northampton in Book E. vol. 1. page 271 &c. 3. Deed of conveyance Abraham Bonner  
Administrator of Frederick Bleat died to John Shopp for 795 acres / a residue of the above 995 acres of land / date 20:  
Nov: 1757. 4 Deed of conveyance John Shopp to Abrahm Bonner for 795 acres of land & allowance date 9 Dec: 1757  
5. Deed of conveyance Abraham Bonner & wife to Nathaniel Scidell for two tracts of land one of them  
containing 1284 acres 136 0<sup>2</sup> and the other 110 acres 11 1/2 Pennies & allowance date 5 feb. 1762 —
